



INDO Trust is the Collaborative organization for Child line 1098 project for the Perambalur district since 2015 It is mainly working for 0-18 years old children.

In the Year 2020-2021, INDO Trust Child line 1098 Help line has received 345 calls in total. Among that 257 calls were made to Child line Contact Centre (CCC) and 88 Calls from Intervention.

EARLY INTERVENTION CENTRE FOR HEARING IMPAIRED

Supported by:
Department of Welfare of Differently Abled,
Govt. of Tamilnadu, Perambalur District

Provides special training in Speech, Literacy and Numerical education to the Hearing Impaired Children (0 to 6 years) in Regional language therapy and to get them enrolled in normal education system

This Early Intervention Centre for Hearing Impaired is supported by the District Disabled Welfare Officer, Government of TamilNadu. The main role, responsibility and motto of the EIC is apart from identifying the children, it gives systematic training for learning through special teaching and taking initiative to enroll in the normal schools for their further higher studies and strengthening their confidence among such children for their better future. Noon Meal Scheme has been extended to EIC by Government of Tamilnadu through Anganwadi.

Due to COVID 19, the centre remains Lockdown during the year 2020-2021.

The Special teachers visited the students periodically to monitor the improvement of the students and trained them via online

Family Counseling Centre has been running since 2000 in INDO Trust with the support of TNSWB and CSWB. For this reporting year 2020-2021, total of 135 family welfare cases including 26 Misunderstanding between Husband and Wife case, 09 Maladjustment with in-law case, 14 Alcoholism case, 02 Second Marriage case, 03 Suspicious attitude case, 07 Love affairs & Marriage case, 22 Domestic Violence case, 08 Extra marital Affair case, 14 Depression case, 02 Economic Crises case, 06 Family & Property dispute case, 22 Other cases.

Providing counseling services in DSWO for Domestic violence cases.

The counselor every week goes to all women police station to provide counseling to the client.

The counselor on every Wednesday goes to Muslim women welfare aid society to provide counseling.

Cases will be referred to the free legal aid.

WATER TESTING CENTRE

Collect water samples all around the district and Provide results regarding the quality of the water

The main objective of the project is to evaluate the quality of water available in different region of the district and make use of it by the public accordingly to their needs and utilisation.

The main work of the Laboratory is to take 3000 samples and give the results of the testing water – analysing, preparation of test report, prescribed format and register submission of online report in all over the district on or before 31st March 2021. Laboratory located at TWAD Guest House Alambadi Road, Perambalur.

TWAD Board training Program for IEC and HRD conducted with support of Jal Jeevan Mission in 39 nos of Gram Panchayats of the Alathur block – kolathur, Nattarmangalam, Perumalpalyam, Chettikulam, Karai, sirukanpur – Perambalur District.

The total participants were 195 from village water and sanitation committee members.



SHELTER FOR HOMELESS

Supported by: National Urban Livelihood Mission, Municipality, Ariyalur District

Provide shelter for the homeless people staying in the roadside.

Indo Trust runs the Shelter for Homeless with boarding and lodging as well as short stay home in Ariyalur.

The program is supported by Municipality of Ariyalur including building infrastructure, cots, pillows, blankets, cosmetics, food and medical care. The daily laborers working in this area is also utilizing this facility for short stay.

11 inmates benefitted (Male: 5, Female: 6),

26 local donors supported with clothes, food, fan, lights, induction stove, cleaning material, and necessary items. Occasionally donors celebrated importance days like Diwali, Pongal, Christmas, Ramzan, New year, Birthday of the donors, etc

Female Sex Workers, Male Sex Workers, and Transgender to make aware on HIV/AIDS. The main works was to create awareness, referral services, Diagnosis and distribution of condoms in the target villages. The target groups of High Risk Group (HRG) – FSW and MSM, Bridge Population (BP) – Truckers, In and Out Migrants, Vulnerable Population (VP) – FSW spouse, MSM spouse, Trucker's spouse, Migrant's spouse, widows, widowers and Pre marital sex youth, PLHIV, ANC Mothers and TB patients.

Due to COVID-19, We couldn't go to field, all were contacted through phone calls and given Health awareness and linked with nearby health institutions.

Due to administrative decision the project was withdrawn on 12-01-2021

SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS OF CHILD PROTECTION AND EVOLVING ROAD MAP FOR ADDRESSING CORE PRIORITISED ISSUES -CHILD MARRIAGE AND SKEWED CHILD SEX RATIO Perambalur District

A qualitative study was conducted with 500 samples on "The prevalence of Child Marriages" in 50 villages. The study was conducted though Focused Group Discussions and Stake Holder meeting.

Questionnaire was prepared and data was collected according to the same. Findings and recommendations of the study was submitted to the Director, Social Defense Department.

In the Same way, another survey also conducted on "The Prevalence of Skewed child Sex ratio" in 50 villages with 300 samples from the community and 100 samples from the PHC and Health workers. Findings and recommendations of the study was submitted to the Director, Social Defense Department.
